

JOHNE'S DISEASE REGULATIONS - ASC OF NSW DECLARATION BY EXHIBITOR/EXHIBITOR'S AGENT

being the exhibitor or duly authorised exhibitor's agent (1) of the cattle entered in the 2005 Luddenham Show declare that:
6. The animal(s) have not for any period of their lifetime (2), been in a herd or flock or on a property where, at any time, Johne's Disease was known or suspected (3) to exist.
 7. No eligible animal (4) has been introduced into a herd or property from a herd or property where I have any reason to believe Johne's Disease is known or suspected to exist.
 8. I undertake to advise the Chairman of the Agricultural Society Veterinary Committee if there is any new information which would alter the above.
 9. I acknowledge that the Agricultural Society relies on the above and I accept personal responsibility for its truth and accuracy.

Should the exhibitor be unable to complete the above Declaration A but a control program is in progress, special consideration will be given and entries may be accepted providing that a history of the herd, details of all tests carried out and names of all veterinarians involved are supplied.

NOTES:

1. An "Owner's Authorised Representative" should only sign this declaration where he or she has a detailed knowledge of the disease history of the herd.
10. If the property of birth and subsequent property movements are unknown, Part A cannot be certified.
11. Johne's Disease may be "suspected" where it has not been specifically ruled out as a cause of chronic wasting problems that have occurred in the herd.
12. "Eligible animals" are cattle, goats, alpaca and deer, including, but not limited to the introduction of buffs, teasers or recipients, animals introduced for or returning from agistment and young animals returning after being reared away from the herd.

Herd status is determined by the Registrar, NSW EBL scheme.</p> | <p>4. <input type="checkbox"/> Queensland from an Accredited or Certified Free herd (attach evidence)</p> <p>or</p> <p>5. <input type="checkbox"/> South Australian from a Monitored Negative or Tested Negative herd (attach evidence)</p> <p>or</p> <p>6. <input type="checkbox"/> Western Australia or Tasmania (no evidence of herd or animal status required).</p> <p>or</p> <p>7. <input type="checkbox"/> Victoria or Northern Territory and all animals presented have been tested negative on blood collected within 30 days of the starting date of the show; and the herd has had no evidence of EBL during the two years prior to the show (attach veterinary evidence).</p> |
